This is Musashimaru's Pre-Sekitori records As I am missing certain information as well some shikonas are not familiar to me, perhaps you can help out to correct any errors/omission as well to add if you can

For instance I am trying to figure out the kimarites.

1989 Aki Basho Mae-zumo "Shin-Jo Ichiban Shusse"
(meaning he won three bouts and no loss but his opponents are not known.)
Weight: 147 kg 18 years old

1989 Kyushu Basho Jonokuchi West 41 - Jonokuchi Yusho
- 7 wins - 0 loss

Day 4 Hidenokuni - win (1)
Day 6 Kotofukushima - win

(1) On November 15, 1989, Musashimaru was supposed to enter from East while Hidenokuni was supposed to come in from West but Musashimaru mistakenly stepped in on the dohyo from West so Hidenokuni started from East. The dohyo judges realized the error but since both rikishis could not understand Japanese at the time, they let the bout proceed. Hidenokuni was from England.

(2) Initially with Futagoyama Beya, Naruto Beya's former Maegashira 4 Rikio. He had a series of personality clashes with Naruto Oyakata and his wife and finally went AWOL in August 1997. Subsequently he joined All Japan Pro Wrestling and NOAH.

(3) Asahiya Beya's former Juryo 6 Iwatefuji. Retired at Aki Basho 1991.

(4) Mihogaseki Beya's former Juryo 11 Akinomine. Retired at Hatsu Basho 1996.

(5) Tokitsukaze Beya's former Maegashira 2 Aogiyama. Retired at Kyushu Basho 2003. Currently Edagawa oyakata.

(6) Oshioyama Beya's former Juryo 12 Seifuriki. Retired at Haru Basho 1998.

(1) Tsunami Beya's former Maegashira 6 Tatsuhikari. Retired at Haru Basho 1999. He was Tatsuhikari Kumagoro - he named himself "Kumagoro" as he fancied himself looking like a bear ("kuma" in Japanese is a bear) and his birth place in Hokkaido was known for bear population.

(2) Tatsutagawa Beya's former Juryo 13 Fukunosato. Retired at May Basho 1993. He had an exactly one Juryo basho with 5 wins and 10 losses.

(3) Isegahama Beya's former Juryo 11 Kiyonofuji. Retired at September Basho 1998. He had two Juryo bashos both Makekoshi (7-8 and 6-9).

(4) Tokitsukaze Beya's former Juryo 5 Yutakafuji. Retired at Kyushu Basho 2000. He had 13 Juryo bashos.

(5) Oshioyama Beya's former Maegashira 14 Hitachiryu. Retired at September Basho 1996. He had three Makuuchi bashos - two Makekoshis and one kyujo Basho (7-8, 0-0-15, 5-10).

(1) Azumazeki Beya's Takamio was one of the heaviest rikishis clicking in at 199 kg.
(2) His shikona is well known as it is almost impossible to read correctly.
(3) Takadagawa Beya's Maegahira 4 Kiraiho. Retired at Nagoya 1996.
(4) Hanakago/Hanaregoma Beya's former Maegashira 13 Komafudo. Retired at Kyushu Basho 1995. He had exactly one Makuuchi basho with 5 wins and 10 losses. He owns a chanko restaurant in Tokyo's Suginami ward called "Sekkisui Tokyo", listed on http://sumo.goo.ne.jp/ozumo_joho_kyoku/taberu/017.html

(2) Takasago Beya's former Juryo 13 Umenosato. Retired at Hatsu Basho 2001. He had exactly one Juryo basho with 5 wins and 10 losses record. He is a

Heya manager for Nishikido Beya.
(3) Kumagatani Beya's former Juryo 4 Yoshinobori.
Retired at May Basho 1993.

* Musashimaru's total record : 52 wins and 18 losses.
